

The next meeting of the International Women's Day Committee is to be held on Wednesday, October 22, 1980 at 7:30pm at the University Settlement House at 23 Grange Road.

The educational series that the education committee has been presenting has been going very well and attracting a good number of women. The first three have dealt with the issues of violence against women, the family and sexuality. The discussions have been excellent and the following are planned:

We have endorsed the demonstration that is to be held on October 23 at 3:30 in the afternoon at Queen's Park. A representative of IWDC has been taking part in a Riverdale anti-racist coalition that is planning an all day educational and cultural event on November 1, Saturday. There will be an open house at the Sikh Temple from 12 to 3pm and workshops and other activities at Eastdale Secondary School from 3pm on. Food and daycare will be available. IWDC will be involved in presenting a workshop on Women and the Klan.
